

Questions about the EMS Levy?



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What's on my election ballot?

Benton County Fire District #1 is asking voters to approve a levy for Emergency Medical Service.

Why is my fire district asking for this?

EMS calls increased 10 percent last year, and currently account for more than half of all emergencies. Benton #1 wants to improve ambulance response times and provide a higher level of care for local residents.

Don't we already have an EMS program?

Currently, we rely on neighboring agencies to provide Advanced Life Support and transport patients to area hospitals. This often takes longer to reach you or a loved one during an emergency, which is what we want to improve.

What will funding be used for?

Funding will be used to purchase and outfit two ambulances, and staff them with licensed EMS providers.

What will it cost?

The EMS levy is capped at 50 cents per \$1,000 of assessed property value. That's approximately \$8.33 per month for the owner of a \$200,000 home.

How will it improve service?



Having ambulances to serve our community will reduce response times by seven minutes on average. Benton #1 also will have trained paramedics providing Advanced Life Support during medical emergencies. This is the highest level of emergency medical care currently available.
