# **FINANCIAL REPORT**

## **Fund Transaction Details**

Presented to the Board were 2017 transactions #1101 through #1142. The transactions total \$88,094.41. General Fund \$28,095.92; Hazmat Fund \$58,591.29; and Training Center Operations Fund \$1,407.20. Commissioner Sleater made a motion to approve the vouchers. Commissioner Morris seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously. The voucher registers are attached to these minutes and constitute a part thereof.

#### **REPORTS**

Commissioners, chief and staff reported the following:

- A regional FEMA FireAct grant was awarded for the purchase of live fire training props.
   Two props are to be located in Benton County and one in the Franklin County area. The grant totaled \$517,350, with a 10-percent matching fund requirement of \$47,031; the matching funds are to be divided equally between all nine participating agencies.
- Dispatch consolidation is moving forward; various subcommittees are being identified by the Chiefs.

- The Incident Management Teams (IMT) have been dispatched to Chelan County and twice to Yakima County recently. The District also had resources assigned to the Silver Dollar Fire which occurred on Hanford and Bureau of Land Management land.
- Station 130 was experiencing issues with a bay door; service was called out and the
  issue has been repaired. Station 120 was experiencing HVAC issues; service was called
  out for repair.
- Allen Electric was called out to the Fire Training Center due to lighting issues; several ballasts were changed.
- E1133 lost a block heater on Friday; it is in the maintenance shop and should be back in service today. A tire blew out on the low boy yesterday and it has been repaired. E1111 is back in service.
- Station 120 crew has been training and getting familiar with E1152, the new Skeeter Type 5 brush truck. A driver's checklist has been developed. The apparatus is currently in the maintenance shop to mount tools and equipment.
- B/C Taylor went to two fires with the IMT; the Sutherland Complex and the Silver Dollar fire.
- PIO Baker reported that the District participated in the Rancho Reata Homeowners Extravaganza. Great turnout of volunteers and the community. She is attending a Juvenile Firesetters meeting today.
- A special Hazmat Board meeting is scheduled for July 19, to discuss budget and agency assessment process.
