Information is an exchange of information
It is a "two way" conversation
Includes two or more people

What is communication?

A sender Message transmitted A receiver Message received

What are the key elements?

Before you key up the mic, listen

Collect your thoughts before broadcasting

- Keep your transmission to brief, concise statements.
- Wait for confirmation from the other person.
- If reply is incorrect, notify immediately and transmit again.

What are some best practices

Stick to the basics... who, what, how, when, why

- Keep your message brief and concise
- Overcome cognitive dissonance
- Always receive confirmation message was correctly received
- Avoid slang or technical jargon
- Remember the listener may use other terminology than you use
